Professional Development



The RMI program has been busy at many levels seeking to add opportunities for student development and stronger interactions with industry. A few examples of the more prominent endeavors include the introduction of the SOAR

Professional Development and the emerging Professional Education Programs. SOAR includes a series of mini-professional development workshops aimed at better-preparing our students for entrance into the professional world. The Professional Education Program encourages our students to pursue professional designations while still a student. Students are reimbursed for costs associated with exam materials through grants provided by the Spencer Educational Foundation and Dallas Fort Worth RIMS. Additionally, we are currently in the process of creating a formal UNT RMI Mentoring Program that will pair our students with professionals working in the local insurance industry. If you are
