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Additional Advising Information

Catalog Year

Your catalog year typically refers to the academic year you were first admitted into UNT. Your catalog year is important because you follow the curriculum requirements that were in effect that academic year. For example, if you were admitted in Fall 2024, your catalog year is 2024-2025.

Each time you view your audit, make sure you're reviewing the catalog year requirements appropriate for you - this document is covering the 2024-2025 requirements. The online tracksheets (https://ryan.unt.edu/undergrad/tracksheets) for each major are based on the requirements for each catalog year. Therefore, it is important that you view and follow the tracksheet for your catalog year or you may take incorrect courses.

An online degree audit lists all your degree requirements in a user-friendly format referred to as the "interactive audit". It is a great tool for helping you stay on track for graduation and preparing for advising appointments.

Your audit will show you:

- Credit hours earned and credit hours in-progress
- How courses you take will apply to your degree requirements
- UNT, overall, and major GPAs
- "What if" degree audits, if you are considering a change of major

As grades post and requirements are completed at the close of each semester, your audit will update automatically. Using this tool in collaboration with your academic advisor will help you make the most of your time, money and course selection while attending UNT. Credit Hours

Every course you take is measured by units called credit hours. In most cases, credit hours represent the number of hours each week you are expected to attend each specific class. Courses may range from one to six credit hours.

Academic Classification

Your classification is based on the number of hours you have earned. Completion of minimum hours required for a degree does not guarantee completion of all degree requirements.

- Freshman 0-29 hours
- Sophomore 30-59 hours
- Junior 60-89 hours
- Senior 90 hours and above

GPA Requirements

- 2.0 UNT GPA required for good standing
- 2.0 Overall GPA (all transfer and UNT courses combined)
- 2.7 PBUS GPA required

RCOB GPA Requirements for Graduation

- 2.0 required for UNT cumulative GPA and overall GPA
- 2.7 Professional Field GPA required for BCIS and BUAN majors
- 3.0 Professional Field GPA required for BS/MS ACCT major
- 2.0 Professional Field GPA required for all additional RCOB majors
