- Before enrolling in MATH 1190, the correct math placement is required or you must pass the prerequisite math with a grade of C or higher.
- **Bolded courses** are pre-business prerequisites to all JR/SR level business courses and require a grade of C or higher. **Additionally**, completion of all pre-business prerequisite courses with a minimum 2.7 pre-business GPA and a minimum 2.0 UNT cumula ve GPA along with completion of 45 hours are required prior to enrolling in any JR/SR level business course and/or filing for an official degree plan.
- A total of 120 credit hours are required for this degree. GPA requirements for graduation: 2.0 UNT cumulative, Professional Field varies by
 major (see advisor), and 2.0 Overall.

^{**} Courses that will fulfill university core and pre-business requirements. Courses used to fulfill both University and College requirements will increase number of required free electives to reach the 120 hours minimum for graduation.
