- Bolded courses are pre-business prerequisites to all JR/SR level business courses and require a grade of C or higher. Additionally, completion of
 all pre-business prerequisite courses with a minimum 2.7 pre-business GPA and a minimum 2.0 UNT cumulative GPA along with completion of
 45 hours are required prior to enrolling in any JR/SR level business course and/or filing for an official degree.
- A total of 120 credit hours are required for this degree. GPA requirements for graduation: 2.0 UNT cumulative, Professional Field varies by major (see advisor), and 2.0 Overall.
